

How well do children achieve at our school?



At the end of the Early Years Foundation Stage 2023:

 76% reached the expected level (66% National 2022)

Phonics Screening (Year 1)

• 77%

(75% National 2022)

At the end of KS1 2023 (Year 2):

- Reading 74% reach expected level or above (69% national 2022)
- Writing 68% reach expected level or above (58% national 2022)
- Maths 85% reach expected level or above

(68% national 2022)

Children also achieve well in self-confidence and independence, as well as growing spiritually and in a range of areas such as PE, dance, music and singing.

As a small infant school our children have the opportunity to develop as individuals.

We get involved early

- Before joining
 - Individual Parent Meeting for families new to the school, and Pre-School handover meetings
 - Drop-in play session for families
 - Visit day for children (transition)
 - Those attending our Pre-School have the benefit of additional opportunities for getting to know the school.

- Listen to you as soon as you have concerns
- Work with you to address any needs your child has soon as they are identified
- Involve other agencies as soon as possible to support you or your child's learning

We have a Strong Progressive Curriculum

- We strongly believe in providing a broad and balanced curriculum.


