Maybe we become excited about people in our world today, footballers, singers, fashion gurus. But when you have lived as long as I have, you become disillusioned by them all! They never seem to deliver the promises they make! John the Baptist looked for a different kind of change, one that is not focused on what others do, but on what we must do ourselves. I cannot change others, but I can change myself. We often think, what's the point? My little effort is not going to change the world! John the Baptist focuses our thinking in a different way. He invites us to make an effort to change our lives, so that we will be ready to meet with Jesus, the One who will baptise us with the Holy Spirit and fire. Now when this happens in our lives, there really is a difference! And so we pray that we too, might be open to the fire of the Spirit within our minds and hearts, changing us so that we will become saints.
