Celebrating Pentecost Sunday

Please take some time over the next few days to come together, as a family, in prayer.

Pentecost Sunday, this year, is celebrated on 23rd May.



The Feast of Pentecost, as the name suggests, is fifty days after Easter. This is the day when Jesus fulfilled his promise to pour out the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. Do you remember what happened on Good Friday? Most of these disciples ran away. They spent the next few days in hiding. Even when Jesus appeared to them and showed them his wounds, they were not totally convinced about what seemed to be happening. After Ascension Day, they did what Jesus asked them to do. They returned to Jerusalem and waited to be clothed with power from on high. And now, this little group of disciples was instantly changed! They are filled with bold confidence, they are quite prepared to go out onto the streets and to bear witness to Jesus. They do what Jesus promised would happen, they can work miracles in his name. They teach in a very powerful way, the message of Jesus, and hearts and lives are changed! Wow, what a wonderful day that must have been! Wouldn't you like to be standing in the streets of Jerusalem when all this was taking place?



The truth is, we can experience this in our own lives today. Pentecost is a picture of what the Church is called to be. Yes I know, it is very difficult to imagine this when we think about our experience of Church these days. But the Holy Spirit has not gone away, and in truth, God is still wanting to share the things which happened on Pentecost day with us today. Please do join me in praying for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit. I can still remember being about 14 years old, and praying one summer evening in my bedroom. The room was filled with light, and something happened which made me filled with joy and peace. You could say, this was my personal Pentecost. And of course, we receive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Well isn't this all wonderful! There is only one little problem... The first disciples of Jesus, despite their betrayal and weakness, were open to what God was doing. As we celebrate the feast of Pentecost this year, let us pray that this will be our experience too. Come Holy Spirit!




Set aside some time in your day to gather together for prayer Make sure you are all sitting comfortably Light a candle

Pentecost Day



Pentecost comes from a Greek word meaning 50

Pentecost Sunday is 50 days after Easter Sunday.

The friends of Jesus were filled with the Holy Spirit and were sent out to tell everyone the good news of Jesus



Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church because the disciples, on that day, started the Church that we now belong to.





A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles
