A Message from Bishop David

My dear young friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord. Mary and Joseph take the baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord. The presentation of a first born infant is an important moment in a Jewish family at the time of Jesus. The Holy Family are recognising that every child is a gift from God, that the Jewish family belongs to a people who were redeemed from slavery in Egypt and led by God to the promised land. What is significant about this moment are two other people who are also in the Temple on that day. A man named Simeon is someone who has real faith that God will deliver on His promises. When he sees Jesus, his life is fulfilled and he is happy. Are we happy to meet with Jesus in the sacraments? And then there is an elderly lady called Anna. I love the way she is filled with joy when she meets Jesus. She dances! She tells everyone else about what God is doing. Are we filled with joy when we meet with Jesus? Do we want to tell everyone about Him? On this lovely Feast, we can bless candles and celebrate the moment when Jesus, the light of the world, comes into our midst. Why not ask Jesus today to come into a dark world and to bring new hope and encouragement. He is still the Light of the world! God bless.

She was eighty four years old.


Anna and Simeon

A Reading from the Gospel according to Luke

Glory to you O Lord

Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple as the Bible told them to. They wanted to thank God for Jesus.

At the Temple, they met an old man called Simeon.

He was a good and holy person. He often went to the Temple to pray. When he saw Jesus Simeon took him in his arms and praised God.

Simeon blessed them.

Mary and Joseph were amazed at all they had seen and heard. They left the Temple and went back home to Nazareth where Jesus grew up and learned to praise God.

Let us look at the candle and say thank you for ourselves that we are children of the light who walk in the light of the Lord everyday

We thank God together as we say:

In the Temple Simeon knew that Jesus would bring light to the whole world.

Let us think about and pray for people from the five continents of the world.





We pray for the homeless, the starving, those suffering from war and violence and all those who are sick especially with coronavirus across the whole world.

We ask God's blessing on the people of Asia.



We ask God's blessing on the people of Africa.
