A message from our Bishop

When I was much younger I used to think of the Blessed Trinity as a mathematical problem: how could there be three Persons in the One God? Maybe you are familiar with the way that St Patrick helped the Irish people to understand this fundamental mystery of our Catholic faith. He picked up a shamrock leaf, growing around the meadows of Ireland, one leaf and three leaves.

As I got older and matured in my Christian faith, the Blessed Trinity became less of a problem and more of a life-giving truth. It makes sense to me, to think of God as a community of Persons. We are made for community, because we are created in God's image likeness. And what a beautiful relationship these three divine Persons enjoy with each other. The Father loves his beloved Son Jesus and has loved him from all eternity. For his part, Jesus is obedient to his Father. The love between them is so strong, it is the third Person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit.

When we were baptised, we were immersed into the life and love of the Trinity. God, our heavenly Father, adopted us as his child. We became brothers and sisters of Jesus. In the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, we receive the life of the Holy Spirit as seven wonderful gifts. We are destined to spend eternal life with the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

May God our Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit bless you always,



The one who created the world, the sun and the moon, the oceans, the dry land, all the animals, flowers and you and me.









We might think of Jesus.
