Weekly learning

Information about some of the things we will be learning in the week beginning 14th February 2022



English

This week we will be learning how to write instructions. We will be looking at imperative verbs (bossy verbs) and how these tell us what to do - an action word that expresses a command or request (eg. mix, chop, shut) We will read different instructions and make a checklist to help us remember what makes good instruction writing. We will then write instructions for making fruit Kebabs. We will use our instructions to make our fruit kebabs in our lessons. Can you find any recipes/instructions to follow in the kitchen at home? Can you spot the imperavtive verbs?

Maths Can you tell if a number is odd or even? We will be recognising what makes an odd or even number. We will use counters to see if the number is able to be shared evenly or not.

Next we will use practical equipment to divide by 5 and by 10. We are learning to solve division number sentences. 25 cakes shared by 5 people - How many each? RE

We will be learning about the different parts to the mass. Children will act out and sequence the different parts of mass. We will also be looking at the words used by the parish family during the Eucharistic prayer and talking about how they sometimes also sing these words. Children will discuss its meaning and create a painting in response to the words. We will talk about what images the words make us think of. Below are the words we will be looking at.

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, Hosanna in the highest. We will continue to learn how to maintain our balance whilst standing on a line and low beam with a good stance. We will continue to practise the key skills that will help us to do this; which are to keep our feet a shoulder width apart, bend our knees and to keep our backs straight and heads up. We will then practise our blanacing by playing games were we must transfer objects from one end of a beam to another end within a given time.

Music

This week we will listen to the song "I saw her standing there" by The Beatles, and will discuss the following:

We are continuing our learning about spreadsheets using the 2Calculate tool on purple mash. We will learn how to use spreadsheets to add amounts. We will be working out how much we need to pay using coins by using a spreadsheet to help calculate. We will also be learning how to use images in a spreadsheet.

Topic - Design Technology

This week linked to our English instructions we will be designing, making and evaluating our own Fruit Kebabs. These will be inspired by fruits typically found in the rainforest.

The children will have time to practice some knife skills prior to making their kebabs using playdoh.

They will learn the bridge hold and the claw grip to hold different fruits when we are cutting them.
