OUR CATHOLIC LIFE...

St Peter & St Paul Feast Day 29th June

On this day, we celebrate the life of two special saints. We celebrate with Mass in the parishes and in school we will be holding special prayer sessions in the classes with the children and teaching them about St Peter and St Paul.

Did you know...

- St. Peter and St. Paul are both patron saints of Rome and considered cornerstones of the Church.
- St. Paul became a good man when he heard the voice of God and spent the rest of his life preaching the Gospel. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them, we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church. He is acclaimed as one of the most important apostles who spread the word of Jesus
- St. Peter was once named Simon and he was a fisherman of Galilee. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means 'Rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build his Church. St. Peter was one of the 12 apostles, as well as the first Pope and founder of the Roman Church.

Governors for our Catholic Schools

Transition Arrangements 2023

If they are attending St Edward's please inform Club staff if you wish them to be taken across to St Edward's or you will be doing this yourself. You can also collect your child yourself or they will be collected by Club staff to attend their paid for After School Club or Multi-Sport session. Please notify the school office of your drop off and collection arrangements for Transition Day.

REMINDERS...

PE Uniform (Reception, Y1, Y2)

- A reminder that your child must wear the correct PE uniform on class PE days:
- Dark Blue shorts or Dark Blue/Black tracksuit bottoms or leggings
- White T-shirt
- Sports footwear
- PE Uniform should be worn with the school jumper or school cardigan.
- (Hoodies and multi-coloured sports kit/t-shirts should not be worn on PE days).

Reminder - A Change to School Uniform (Reception, Year 1, Year 2)

A reminder that from September 2023 there will be a slight change to the school uniform.

Please note the changes being brought in will start from the new September 2023 intake. There is no requirement to change to the new styles as the new uniform will be phased in over the next three years.

The changes will be as follows:

- The current jumper will be replaced with a crew necked sweatshirt
- The current cardigan will be replaced by a sweatshirt style cardigan
- A tie will no longer be a part of the uniform
- The white button shirt/blouse will be replaced with a white polo shirt with optional logo for all year groups.

This is in response to the growing costs of the existing jumpers/cardigans. The sweatshirt styles are a cheaper alternative.

Reminder - Change to Times of the School Day from September 2023

In line with Department for Education Guidance that schools provide 32.5 hours school time, the official school day here at St Joseph's Catholic Infant school will increase from September 2023.

Named Property

Please ensure that all of your child's items and any new items you buy for use in school are 'named' immediately. This helps us to return items promptly should they become lost.

Requesting Leave of Absence (YR, Y1, Y2)

Any Absence from school will impact on your child's learning and their school attendance record.

Regular and punctual attendance at school is important and a legal requirement. May we remind parents that the school cannot authorise absence during term time, unless there are exceptional circumstances. An 'Application for Exceptional Leave of Absence' form should be completed. This is available on the school website or a paper copy may be obtained from the school office.

The Department for Education advises that parents should not normally take pupils out of school or away on holiday during term time.

School Milk

Our school provides a milk scheme which is available to all pupils via our milk supplier Cool Milk.

Free milk is available to order for all children under five. When a child turns five, parents have the opportunity to pay a subsidised rate for their child to continue to receive milk in school.

Pupils entitled to Pupil Premium funding are entitled to free school milk.
