play dough to help us remember that we are a follower of Jesus.




This week Year One have begun a new topic in Maths – addition and subtraction within 20. We have explored number bonds to 20 and doubling numbers up to 10.

In English the children have shown their incredible writing skills and rewritten their own version of our class story Beegu. Their use of capital letters, full stops and adjectives is amazing!

We have had a very exciting time learning about Lunar new year. We have created mandarin lan-

terns, made snake decorations and practised writing in Mandarin. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning the traditions of Lunar New Year and the story of the great race.











. It has been another busy week in Year 2, where the children have completed lots of fantastic learning. In English, we have been learning lots of interesting

facts about bears and have created a small non-chronological report using these facts. We have loved reading these and some of the sentences were incredible! Maths has seen us

begin our new topic of Multiplication and Division. We have used lots of practical equipment such as counters and pictures to make and show equal groups. As the week has progressed, we have moved onto linking multiplication to repeated addition and introduced the multiplication symbol as a way to show equal groups and the amount in each group. For example: four equal groups of two is the same as 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 or  $4 \times 2$ . In RE, we have reflected on our learning about Books. The children have enjoyed learning about how Cath-



olics use books in their faith and their prayers. Finally, we ended the week with an insightful talk about Lunar New Year. The children were incredibly thoughtful and asked some great questions.



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
