


Weekly Learning Reception 08/05/23





Focus story: The Very Busy Spider

Key Vocabulary: spin, silky, thread, meadow.

Communication and Language

We are learning to/about:

Remembering, celebrating and responding to the understanding that everyone has good news and that Pentecost is the celebration of the Good news of Jesus.

Try this at home:

How do you celebrate good news? Gather with your family and make a family prayer you could even add a song

We are learning to/about:

How to control our feelings by managing our own personal emotions. How we can respect and respond to each other's ideas.

Try this at home:

Draw the spider with a speech bubble and write down what he might have wanted to say or how he felt when the other animals asked him to play with them.

We are learning to/about:

How to move with control and coordination showing different actions and movement.

Try this at home:

Can you pretend to be a spider? How do spiders move? Crawl and jump high and low like a spider. Go round and round like you are spinning your web.

We are learning to/about:

Talk about the story using new vocabulary retell the story with actions. Beginning to understand and ask questions about how and why.

Try this at home:

Write a list of all the animals in the story and what noises they made. You can even draw the animals too if you like.

Literacy

We are learning to:

How to demonstrate an understanding of stories by retelling the story in your own words.

Try this at home: Can you draw another animal that could have visited the Spider, Draw a speech bubble and write the question in it that they would ask the Spider, Don't forget the question mark.?

Maths We are learning to/about:

Recognise numbers 1 to 20 adding 1 more each time looking at first, then and now. Grouping numbers into to 2 groups and counting on to find how many altogether.

Try his at home:

Sing the Incy Wincy Spider song and see if you can work out how many spiders are left at the top of the spout each time, repeat the song.

Understanding the World

We are learning to/about:

Different mini-beasts and what they look like. How are they are different to each other, how do they change and grow, where do they live, what do they eat?

Try this at home:

Go on a Spider Adventure to find out lots of fact all about spiders. Can you find any spiders in your garden or on a woodland walk?

Expressive Arts and Design

We are learning to/about:

Planning, making and drawing different pictures and objects to retell stories or create your own characters.

Try this at home:

Can you use sticks, straws, string, thread, tape or other materials to recreate the spider's web from the story? See if you can make a spider.
